

ABOUT THE WINEMAG.CO.ZA TASTING PROGRAMME 2022

Winemag.co.za produced a series of category reports over the course of the year with multinational financial services company Prescient as sponsor. Each report was based on the outcome of a blind tasting of wines entered within a specific category.

A report includes key findings, tasting notes for the top wines, buyer's guide and scores on the 100-point quality scale for all wines entered. Upon release, producers can purchase both Top 10 and regular rating stickers – consumers are encouraged to look out for these in the retail environment.

JUDGING PROCEDURES

The judging panel was chaired by me and further consisted of two trusted colleagues, namely wine writer Malu Lambert and James Pietersen, CEO of Wine Cellar, Cape Town merchants and cellarers of fine wine.

We tasted blind, labels out of sight. Ratings were done according to the 100-point system, final scores awarded on the basis of discussion that involved retasting where necessary rather than relying solely on arithmetic averaging.

KEY FINDINGS

The 2019 vintage is generally considered challenging, the harvest initially looking promising with favourable weather conditions contributing to excellent grape analyses up until the end of February, but unusually cold, rainy weather arrived in March which made for slow ripening.

Even so, wines from this vintage showed remarkably well in the tasting for this year's Cabernet Sauvignon Report – Cab, of course, is a late variety and generally seems to have delivered elegant wines, lower sugars leading to lower alcohols.

There were 64 entries from 51 producers in total, with 32 (50%) rated 90-plus on the 100-point quality scale. 17 entries came from the 2019 vintage, 13 of these rated 90-plus and when considering the Top 10 specifically, 2019 made up seven of them. As for the vintages either side, wines from 2018 in many instances are starting to look quite evolved and probably should not be kept for much longer while those from 2020, by contrast, tend to appear youthful and unresolved.

With respect to which growing area predominates, Stellenbosch again had the most wines in the Top 10 with six, followed by two multi-site blends from Nederburg and then Voor Paardeberg and Walker Bay with one each.

Though the 2019 growing season was difficult, with the Autumn rains presenting growers with the problems of rot and uneven ripeness, those who managed to prevail seem to have made particularly pure and precise wines. Judging phenolic ripeness (the flavour and texture imparted by tannins) has always been key in making great Cab but it seems producers are becoming more and more astute avoiding both wines that are either unnecessarily astringent or too soft and "squishy". Equally, how maceration (the extraction of colour and tannin) is handled in the cellar also seems defter.

The average price of the 32 wines to rate 90-plus is R303 a bottle and of the Top 10 is R353. Offering the best quality relative to price is Maastricht 2020 with a rating of 91 and selling for R130 a bottle.

Koelenhof, as producer of the wine judged best overall, wins a 2BFermControl organic fermentation kit worth approximately R11 000.



TOP 10 TASTING NOTES



Stellenbosch 1679 2019 (Koelenhof)

Price: R375

Total Production: I 780 bottles Abv I3.63%

24 months in 300-litre French oak, 100% new. Compelling aromatics of red and black berries, flowers, herbs and pencil shavings. Great fruit definition, bright acidity and fine tannins, the finish super-dry. This has depth but also verve – pure, poised and wonderfully well structured.





Cavalli 2019

Price: R250

Total Production: 7 800 bottles Abv 14.12%

Matured for 24 months in French oak, approximately 30% new. Complex aromatics of red and black berries, vanilla and oak spice with some subtle notes of violets and herbs in the background. The palate is medium bodied with juicy fruit and good grip, the finish gently savoury.





Neil Ellis Jonkershoek Valley 2018

Price: R520

Total Production: 12 000 bottles Abv 14.5%

Matured for 18 months in French oak, 100% new. Enticing aromatics of oystershell, red and black berries, floral perfume, some leafiness plus hints of vanilla and oak spice. The palate is medium bodied and taut – good fruit definition, fresh acidity and appropriately firm tannins. Layers of flavour.





Vondeling Barrel Selection 2019

Price: R175

Total Production: 13 500 bottles Abv 13.52%

Matured for 16 months in 300-litre French oak barrels, one-third new. Red and black berries, some cigar box, vanilla and oak spice on the nose. The palate is dense and smooth textured in the best sense – pure fruit, bright acidity and firm but fine tannins. Harmonious and long.





Benguela Cove Estate 2019

Price: R295

Total Production: 6 400 bottles Abv 13.97%

Matured for 20 months in 300-litre barrels, 40% new. Red and black berries, a floral note and fresh herbs on the nose. The palate is medium bodied with good clarity of fruit, lovely freshness and fine tannins. Plenty of detail, the finish long and savoury.





Delaire Graff Reserve 2019

Price: R875

Total Production: 5 000 bottles Abv 14.5%

Matured for 16 months in French oak, 80% new. Red and black berries, floral perfume and some leafiness on the nose while the palate is sumptuous and broad with creamy tannins, the finish gently savoury. Plush but very well handled.





Ernie Els Major Series 2018

Price: R250

Total Production: 30 000 bottles Abv 14.38%

Matured for 17 months in 300-litre French oak barrels, 20% new. Dark berries, violets, fennel and pencil shavings on the nose. The palate, meanwhile, is powerful – excellent fruit density, bright acidity and firm tannins that make for a long, dry finish.





Nederburg The Manor House 2019

Price: R220

Total Production: 84 025 bottles Abv 14.69%

Grapes sourced from across the Western Cape. Matured for 25 months in French and American oak, partially new. Red and black berries, some attractive herbal character, cola, pencil shavings and oak spice on the nose. The palate is plush with good depth of fruit, bright acidity and smooth tannins. Plenty of power.





Nederburg Private Bin Two Centuries 2018

Price: R395

Total Production: 3 000 bottles Abv 14.67%

Grapes from Philadelphia and Simondium. Matured for 28 months in French oak, 100% new. Red and black berries, violets, herbs, pencil shavings and toast on the nose. The palate is big and bold – good depth of fruit, bright acidity and nicely grippy tannins, the finish long and savoury.







Zorgvliet 2019

Price: R170

Total Production: 9 939 bottles Abv 14.19%

Matured for 22 months in French oak, 21% new. Rather primary on the nose at this stage with notes of red and black berries, violets as well as vanilla. The palate is full bodied but balanced. Rich but not short of freshness, smooth in texture, the finish nicely dry. Tightly wound, this needs time in bottle.
