ABOUT THE FEDEX NEXT GENERATION AWARDS 2024

The modern era of South African wine, which has been underway for the last three decades or so, has seen some extraordinary quality gains but who's going to ensure that we continue to move forward?

The aim of the Next Generation Awards sponsored by FedEx Express is to identify South Africa's emerging winemaking talent. A condition of entry was that entrants should be under 35 years of age at the time of the awards ceremony on 11 June.

There were 62 entries received from 37 different individuals, with 42 (68%) rating 80-plus on the 100-point quality scale. Below are the Top 10 participants. Natasha Jacka, as the winemaker responsible for the best wine overall, receives a prize of R10,000 while Vusi Dalicuba, as runner-up, receives R2,500.

JUDGING PROCEDURES

The judging panel was chaired by me and further consisted of Spencer Fondaumiere, chairman of the South African Sommelier Association, and wine writer Malu Lambert. We tasted blind, labels out of sight. Ratings were done according to the 100-point system, final scores awarded on the basis of discussion that involved retasting where necessary rather than relying solely on arithmetic averaging.

Natasha Jacka

Age: 30 years, six months

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why?

Before I discovered my passion for wine, I was working as a chef. Over time my interest in wine grew and I contacted Duncan Savage for advice - I so respect his welcoming, genuine and warm nature. I admire his ability both to consistently make sensational wines and build a successful business.

Duncan put me in contact with Riandri Visser just as she was stepping into the roll as head winemaker at Cape Point Vineyards and I was fortunate to join the team. She shared her wealth of knowledge with me from day one and was always extremely patient with me as I began to wrap my head around the science and art of winemaking. I also so admire her strength and humility and she has been an amazing role model for me as a woman in the wine industry.



Alinea Sauvignon Blanc 2021

Best Overall

Price: R180

Wine of Origin: St Helena Bay

Abv: 14.03%

Fermented and matured for six months in older 600-litre barrels. Subtle and alluring aromatics – some smoky reduction before soft citrus, peach, nectarine, hay and white pepper. The palate shows excellent depth of fruit, well integrated acidity and a dry finish. Wonderfully harmonious – concentrated and yet tightly wound.

Age: 30 years, six months

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why? Abrie Beeslaar for his dedication to the South African wine industry. He's great at mentoring young winemakers and encouraging you to always go beyond your limits.



Vergenoegd Löw Cabernet Sauvignon 2022

Runner-up

Price: R280

Wine of Origin: Stellenbosch

Abv: 13.5%

Matured for 18 months in second-, third- and fourth-fill barrels. Pretty aromatics of red and black berries, violets, some leafiness, pencil shavings and oak spice. The palate is pure and focussed – excellent fruit definition, bright acidity and powdery tannins. Supple and refreshing.



Janco de Kock

Age: 27 years, one month

Place of birth: Paarl, Western Cape

Qualification: BScAgric, Viticulture and Oenology,

Stellenbosch University, 2019

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why? Bartho Eksteen for igniting my passion for winemaking while I was a part of his Wijnskool Project at Boland Agricultural High School. Pieter Carstens of Leeuwenkuil, who taught me how less is more and the value of a light touch in the cellar.

I also really admire Eben Sadie – he's demonstrated to me that winemaking starts in the vineyard and I would love to grow my own grapes eventually.



Anco 2023

Price: R295

Wine of Origin: Voor-Paardeberg

Abv: 13.95%

55% Syrah, 28% Grenache, 5% Mourvèdre, 5% Cinsault, 5% Carignan and 2% Alicante Bouschet. One component consisting of Syrah fermented with small percentage of stems added back; a second consisting of a co-fermentation of all six varieties. Matured for 10 months in older 500-litre barrels. Appealing aromatics of red and black berries, lavender, violet, pepper and spice. Luscious fruit, fresh acidity and fine tannins, the finish long and dry. Clean, sappy and wonderfully inviting.



Michelle Waldeck

Age: 29 years, seven months

Place of birth: Kraaifontein, Western Cape

Qualification: BScAgric, Viticilture and Oenology,

Stellenbosch University, 2016

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why? I would without a doubt call Johann Fourie my mentor. He's taught me how important the balance between art and science in winemaking is as well as the need to be humble – winemaking is a team effort, and no one can succeed entirely alone. De Grendel's Charles Hopkins and Bartho Eksteen always remind me how important it is to bring others along.



Benguela Cove Estate Cabernet Sauvignon 2019

Price: R370

Wine of Origin: Walker Bay

Abv: 13.97%

Matured for 20 months in 300-litre oak barrels, 40% new. Cassis, some leafiness, earth, pencil shavings and oak spice on the nose. The palate if full and upright – dense fruit, fresh acidity and firm but not coarse tannins, the finish uncompromisingly dry.

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why? Let's focus on the next generation. We've formed very close friendships with Natasha Pretorius from GlenWood and Natasha Jacka from Alinea. We worked with Natasha in Sancerre over the past two years – her dedication, her capability to remain focussed during chaos and her physical endurance are amazing. Natasha worked the 2017 harvest at Cape Point Vineyards and we were impressed with how hard-working, kind and supportive she was. She's also very detail oriented.



Cape Point Vineyards Isliedh 2022

Wine of Origin: Cape Town

Abv: 14%

66% Sauvignon Blanc, 27% Semillon and 7% Semillon Gris. Fermented and matured for 10 months in barrel. The nose shows citrus, peach, nectarine, hay and potpourri with some intriguing leesy character in the background. The palate has a dense core of fruit, vital acidity and a dry finish. Intricate and refined.





Hanri Ferreira

Age: 30 years, nine months

Place of birth: Oranjemund, Namibia

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why? Erika Obermeyer is someone that comes to mind, also having had her start at Kleine Zalze. Her work with smaller batches from specific vineyard sites is similar to what I most enjoy doing – Project Z follows much of the same ethos. Her wines are typically superbly structured while retaining elegance and freshness.



Kleine Zalze Project Z Alvarinho 2022

Price: R280

Wine of Origin: Stellenbosch

Abv: 13%

Grapes from Devon Valley. Fermented and matured for six months in clay amphorae. Complex aromatics with a herbal top note preceding citrus, apple and nectarine plus some waxy character. A dense core of fruit to go with a ripping acidity (TA is 8.5g/l), the finish long and pithy.

Kleine Zalze Project Z Chenin Blanc 2022

Price: R460

Wine of Origin: Stellenbosch

Abv: 13.77%

70% fermented in concrete egg, 30% in clay amphorae and matured for 10 months. Citrus, peach, lanolin and ginger on the nose while the palate is weighty and thick textured in the best sense – layers of flavour, well integrated acidity and a long finish. Sweet and sour combining to good effect.

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why? Abrie Beeslaar. He played a vital part in the brand building of Kanonkop and is closely associated with the production of high-quality Pinotage. He is a great mentor for younger winemakers and is not afraid to share his "secrets". He's daring, versatile and a great businessman.



Lemberg The Amphora Selection Hárslevelü 2023

Price: R350

Price: K550

Wine of Origin: Tulbagh

Abv: 14.56%

Fermented and matured for nine months in a 630-litre clay amphora. Potpourri, cut apple, stone fruit, orange, ginger and some rancio on the nose. The palate is rich and flavourful, not short of verve, the finish nicely savoury.





Jacobus van Zyl

Age: 34 years, nine months

Place of birth: Rawsonville, Western Cape

Qualification: BScAgric, Viticulture and Oenology,

Stellenbosch University, 2012

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why?

There is no one person I admire more than any other. I've learnt a lot from many of the winemakers with whom I've had the privilege to rub shoulders. I must say that the late Duimpie Bayly had a huge influence on my career — he was a good friend and mentor, and I'll keep our conversations close to my heart.



Jordan The Long Fuse Cabernet Sauvignon 2022

Price: R275

Wine of Origin: Stellenbosch

Abv: 13.5%

Age of vines is 35 to 37 years old. Matured for 18 months in barrel, partially new. Red and black berries, some leafiness, cigar box and pencil shavings on the nose. The palate is medium bodied with fresh acidity and a dry finish. Well balanced and elegant.





Christiaan Nigrini

Age: 29 years, eleven months

Place of birth: Beaufort West, Western Cape

Qualification: B.Agric, Viticulture and Oenology, Elsenburg, 2016

Which winemaker, local or international, do you most admire and why? Danielle le Roux, currently winemaker at Rust en Vrede. I worked as assistant winemaker to her in 2016 at Asara – she's always humble and keen to help you grow. I respect her openness to appreciate all wine styles- she taught me to be sensitive to both the old world and the new, and that you can make both classic and alternative wines.



Welbedacht Chenin Blanc 2023

Price: R200

Wine of Origin: Groenberg

Abv: 12.86%

Grapes from vineyard planted in 1979. Fermentation started in tank and finished in older barrels, maturation lasting 10 months. Pretty aromatics with notes of citrus, floral perfume, hay and just a hint of leesy character. Relatively lean with plenty of drive – pure fruit and punchy acidity before a dry finish.
